

## Ingredients:

- 1 cup mixed vegetables (carrot, capsicum, beans, peas)
- 1 onion (sliced)
- 2 cloves garlic (minced)
- 1 tbsp soy sauce
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1/2 tsp red chilli flakes
- 1/2 tsp turmeric powder
- Salt to taste
