- (a) Write the name of the lesson from which the above lines have been taken. Who is the writer of this lesson? (2)
- (b) What will happen, if we are weak and poor citizens? (2) **Solution**:
- (a) The above lines are taken from the lesson "Citizen and Nation." The writer of this lesson is M.K. Gandhi.
- (b) If we are weak and poor citizens, our country will suffer. Even though we may think that one person's actions do not matter in a large country, every individual's contribution is important.

- (a) Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru regarded the river Ganga as a symbol of India's culture and history. He saw it as the lifeline of the nation, deeply connected to the lives of the people. He believed that just as the Ganga nourished the land, the people of India should also work together for the progress and unity of the country.
- (b) Yaksha was pleased with Yudhishthira because he answered all his questions with wisdom and righteousness. Impressed by his honesty, humility, and adherence to dharma, Yaksha revived Yudhishthira's brothers, who had fallen unconscious after drinking water from the enchanted lake.

Solution:

- (c) Guru Nanak prayed for the people of the second village to remain poor and miserable because their suffering made them humble and kind, unlike the arrogant rich.

Solution:

(b) Pollution

A man was kept in jail without any fault. When the King visited the jail, he told him that he was innocent. The King found out that it was true. The King gave him a sum of money and set him free. He went straight to the market, where some birds were kept for sale. He purchased all the birds from the shopkeeper and set them free. At this, the shopkeeper was surprised. Then the man said to him, "If you had been in prison like me for no fault, you would have done the same."

- (a) Why was the shopkeeper surprised? 3
- (b) What did the man say to the shopkeeper? 3

Solution:

- (a) The shopkeeper was surprised because he did not expect the man to buy all the birds just to release them. Normally, people buy birds to keep them as pets, but this man freed them instead. His action seemed unusual and unexpected to the shopkeeper, making him curious about the reason behind it.
- (b) The man told the shopkeeper that if he had experienced being imprisoned without any fault, he would have understood the suffering of captivity. He explained that his time in jail had made him realise how painful it was to be trapped. By freeing the birds, he was giving them the freedom that he had once lost, showing his empathy towards them.
